A Message From Rabbi Kramer



Since I began serving as rabbi of our community, I have tried to help the synagogue function in a more efficient and productive way. One of the ways I have sought to do this is through the use of technology. Many of the changes that have been made in this regard are not necessarily noticeable outside the office, however some of them are. For example, several months ago we began sending out a weekly email to members of our community as a way of keeping you informed of upcoming events. This has really helped increase communication between the synagogue and the congregation and has allowed us to function in "real time", something that was simply not possible when information was only disseminated in a monthly printed bulletin. Now, we have added another communication tool which I hope will be equally as successful: a new website. CBI has, of course, had a website for several years [designed and maintained excellently by Tom Levin. Thanks for all of your hard work Tom!] but we recently decided to do a complete renovation. Why? Well, we realized that we wanted our website to function on two different levels. On one level, we wanted it to be used as a marketing tool for potential members and as a vehicle for representing our congregation to the larger Chicago Jewish community. On the other level, we wanted it to be a useful tool for communication between the congregation and its members, and for facilitating our members participation in our congregational community. To have our website operate on both levels at once would require thoughtful designing. It would also require a new maintenance system, one where changes to the website could be made in-house, at any time, without requiring any specialized computer knowledge. Thus, a complete renovation was in order.

The website is now up and running, and I believe we have achieved our vision. The site has a lot of great features, and I would like to point out two in particular. The first is the homepage. Every upcoming event for a two month period is listed on the homepage. This was done to make it as simple as possible for you to keep informed of upcoming events. The second feature is our Shop-to-Give program. If you go to our website [www.cbi-nwi.org] and click on the tab labeled 'Giving', you will be directed to information on how you can contribute to the financial well-being of our congregation. If you click on the link for Shop-to-Give, [or go directly to www.cbi-nwi.org/shop-to-give.htm] you will see a number of links to online stores. When you click on one of these links, and make a purchase from the store, CBI receives a percentage of your purchase, ranging from 3 to 15 percent! So please bookmark this page and remember to visit it before you go shopping online. Additionally, if you need to buy a gift for someone, visit our site first and see if we have a link to a store that might sell the perfect gift. And make sure to visit the site often as we will always be adding new links.

I hope that you enjoy the new website. If you have any suggestions on how we can improve it, please let us know.

CBI Youth Donates \$700 to Federation!

As part of Rabbi Kramer's religious school class, fifth through ninth grade students formed a non-profit company last semester. The idea was to create, market and sell a product whose proceeds would be donated to charity. The students decided that they wanted to provide local Jewish children with a new winter coat for Chanukah. The notion of helping to keep a child warm led directly to the idea for the product: a travel coffee mug. The marketing slogan was, 'Keep yourself warm while helping to keep a child warm.' The design chosen for the mugs was that of student Rachel Gross. The mugs were sold prior to and during Chanukah for \$10, bringing in a profit of \$700. The money was given to Jewish Community Services of the NWI Jewish Federation. It will be put in a fund to provide new winter coats for Chanukah for needy Jewish children in our area for many years to come. *Yasher Koach* to all of the students!!

CBI Helps Jews Fulfill the Mitzvah of Tefillin

Believe it or not, there are actually Jews in the world who want to put on tefillin! Unfortunately, many of them cannot afford a pair of tefillin, which often cost upwards of \$400. To meet this need, communities often have Tefillin Banks, which lend people tefillin. However, these banks only loan tefillin to men. One woman, Jen Taylor Friedman (the first woman to write a Sefer Torah), has decided to change this, and has opened a Tefillin Bank in Manhattan that loans out tefillin regardless of one's sex. CBI, sadly, was in possession of many pairs of tefillin which were in bad condition, or which had simply been abandoned. After making an announcement to try to return these abandoned tefillin to their owners, we decided to donate them to the egalitarian Tefillin Bank in Manhattan, where they would be restored and put to good use. Each siyyum will be followed by a festive meal called a *seudat mitzvah*.
